### Semester Project

**Overview:**  
 The project has both an Old Testament, and a New Testament component. After studying each of the textual components, the student is to produce both a written description of their study and a presentation that will be given in class on May 17, 2018

#### Both studies should include

- phrasing of the indicated study text
- Identification of key nouns and verbs, followed by Word Studies including:
  - Study from commentary / lexicon / dictionary-
  - Study, looking for other usages – both contrasting, and supportive
- Identification of key phrases, and how they tie together to accomplish the sense of the text(s).
- Citations for any material that is obtained by other than observation of the Biblical Text.

#### Old Testament Study:

This study has the text in three parts: (10 verses total)  
 Gen 12:1-5 - Abrahamic Covenant  
 Gen 22:17-18 - Re-statement Abrahamic Covenant  
 Gen 26:2-6 - Re-statement Abrahamic Covenant to Isaac

#### Key elements of the study should look at:

- The statements of the covenants - What God has promised
- Conditions under which these events occurred

#### New Testament Study:

This study has the text in one part: (10 verses total)  
 Ephesians 2:1-10 - By Grace through Faith

#### Key elements of the study should look at:

- What was the initial status of the Believer?
- What has God done?
- Why has God done it?
- What is the final status of the Believer?
