Kingdom of God, Definition

- From the time when God's sovereign rule over the universe was challenged by Satan, God has been working to reassert His sovereignty in the sphere of its challenge.
- God's kingdom involves a king who rules, a people who are ruled, and a sphere where this rule is recognized as taking place.
- The kingdom of God involves: (a) God's people
 (b) in God's place (c) under God's rule.

The Kingdom ...



- Presented: Matt 4:17
 Gabriel reports that Jesus is destined to receive the throne of David and to reign over the house of Jacob forever.
- Rejected: Matt 12:22-37
 The significant turning point in Christ's ministry was His rejection by the Jewish religious establishment by accusing Him of casting out demons by the power of Satan

The Kingdom ...


Culmination Delayed: Luke 19:11-27
 Since the kingdom was based on unconditional covenant promises, it could not be canceled even by unbelief. So certain aspects of the kingdom were delayed (rule from throne over Israel's land) for a more responsive generation.

Kingdom ...

Realized Rev 20:4-6
Rev 11:15 indicates that the kingdom promises will be realized following the Tribulation period. At the second advent, the Jews will accept Jesus as their Messiah (Zech 12:10-13:1). After judging the nations (Matt 25:31-46) Jesus will set up His kingdom government and rule the world for 1000 years. At the end of the 1000 year reign 1 Cor 15:24-28 states that Christ will deliver up the reins of His theocratic government to God the Father at which point the millennial kingdom will become an eternal kingdom.

The Kingdom in the Present Age



- Many Pre-millenialists on the other hand, deny any relationship between the church and the kingdom holding that the kingdom is entirely future.
- The scriptures seem to present evidence for both positions — Rather than emphasizing one body of evidence to the neglect of another, believers must come to appreciate the truth of both views.





Baptism

- Ceremonial washing (MIKVEH) was common in the OT, (Lev 15)
- John (the Baptist) preached for repentance, and obedience in Baptism.
- John contrasted his water baptism of repentance with Jesus baptism by the Spirit



Baptism

- Baptized by the Holy Spirit, looks forward to the Pentecost.
- John (The Baptist) had made the connection of Baptism with the Holy Spirit, in Mark 1:8 Mark 1:8 (ESV) 8 I have baptized you with water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
- Repentance, forgiveness, water baptism, and reception of the Holy Spirit comprise the basic pattern of conversion.





The Casting of Lots



- Proverbs 16:33 (ESV)
 - ³³ The lot is cast into the lap, but its every decision is from the LORD.
- Lot casting was a means of determining God's will prior to the indwelling ministry of the Spirit.

Was Matthias God's Choice, Or should they have waited for Paul?

- Paul would not have met the qualifications stipulated by the church,
- Paul's apostleship was of a different order:
 1 Corinthians 15:8—9 (ESV) 8 Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. 9 For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God.
- Matthias was recognized by the church, He was God's choice, not merely the church's. There is nothing in the text to suggest any disapproval of God in the selection of Matthias as a replacement for Judas.
